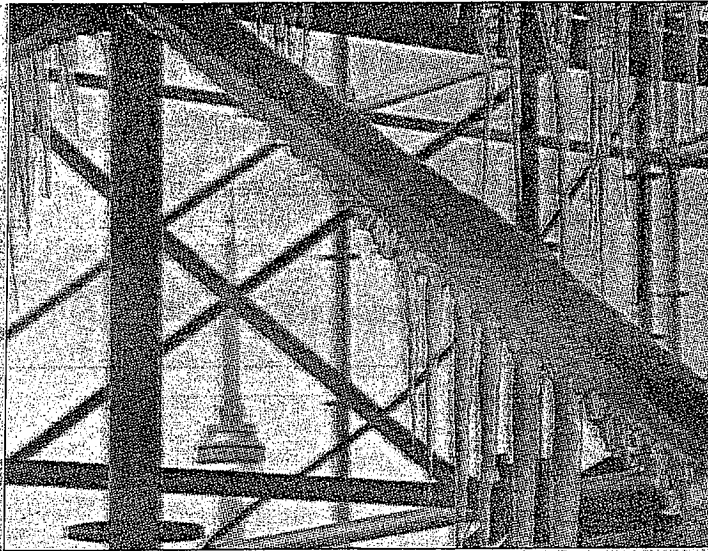

Exchange club for budding snappers

At-risk youth will have a chance to showcase their snapshot skills to the public during the launch of *The Mobile City* book.

This Thursday, youth between the ages of 16 and 22 will unveil the book, which includes digital photography from Toronto and Milan.

"I think it was very successful," said Martin Holley of the Italian Chamber of Commerce of Toronto, which sponsored the event. "Just by looking at all of the participants both here and in Milan they all felt very lucky to have participated in this."

More than 2,000 entries were received and 10 people were selected for their works to appear in the

book. Winners were asked to submit a written description of up to 150 words of their works.

Last July, finalists received a one-week trip to Milan, where they met their Italian counterparts who then spent the next week in Toronto.

"It was the first time it was done and we're trying very hard to have it happen again," Holley said. "For many of them, it was their first trip outside of Toronto."

The launch takes place at the George Brown School of Design on Richmond St. E. at 6 p.m.
